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Entrepreneurial Self-Assessment: Twelve Big Picture Questions

Are you feeling called to start your own business, or to expand your current business, but you're overwhelmed or not sure where to start? Do you have a passion, side gig or hobby that would be fun or interesting to turn into a small business venture? Maybe the details of running your business or the struggle to stay afloat caused you to lose sight of the reasons you started the business in the first place? Or do you worry that your passions won't yield profits? Take this FREE self-assessment to find out to what degree your entrepreneurial passions aren't being met — or haven't been well-defined at this stage. The results will help determine what Big Picture coaching, training or resources will most help you achieve the outcome you desire. **Instructions:** If you haven't already, you may wish to copy off this report. Read through each question carefully and circle your response. Some of the choices will vary for your particular situation. Simply circle the one that most fits or comes the closest to your career circumstances right now.

Some of the scenarios will vary depending on your particular situation. Use your imagination to make them mesh with your job or career scene. While some may sound dry, answer from the gut or your heart, as best you can. We're after how you feel, what's important to you. Jot notes about your particular situation using the NOTES section at the end of this self-assessment.

You'll find a score sheet followed by an analysis of your assessment after the twelve questions. This information is meant to accompany other career self-exporation. You may find further resources at the end of this document.

A. Do you have a clear set of goals for your Big Picture Business?

- 1) Yes, and they are netting me fulfillment AND profit.
- 2) Yes, but they may not be as soulfully or financially rewarding as I'd like.
- 3) Yes, but I don't know how to execute them.
- 4) No, I need to create them.

B. How often have you contemplated starting or expanding your own business?

- 1) Rarely if ever.
- 2) Occasionally, about once a month.
- 3) Often, about once a week.
- 4) Daily.



C. In your current business, how content are you emotionally, spiritually, physically, and financially?

- 1) Completely.
- 2) Mostly.
- 3) Somewhat.
- 4) Barely/Not at all.

D. How helpful do you imagine a "coach" or seasoned business mentor would be in reshaping your Vision, listing step-by-step goals, and implementing a 30-, 60-, and 90-day action plan?

- 1) Not helpful: I have no interest in being helped, no matter how surefire the results would be.
- 2) Somewhat helpful: I wouldn't rule out the idea of getting business tips from a successful entrepreneur.
- 3) Very helpful: I am at a crossroads and need a push.
- 4) Invaluable: I am barely staying afloat and fear that my business is sinking.



E. Which of these describes the obstacles that are keeping you from start-

ing or expanding your business?

- 1) I have nothing standing in my way.
- 2) There are a few minor issues that need addressing, but I possess the systems and strategies to resolve them.
- 3) There are major issues from finances to staff support to logistics to marketing — that need addressing, and I don't know how to resolve some or all of them.
- 4) There are too many issues to count, and I'm too overwhelmed to address them, let alone resolve them. I want this, but I'm terribly discouraged.

F. What is your current passion-to-profit ratio?

- 1) My business is equal parts passion and profit.
- 2) My business is about 40/60, but I'm not too far off my goals pathway for earning a living doing what fulfills me.
- 3) My business is very unbalanced [MUCH more about pursuing my passions and NOT making enough money at it; or MUCH more about seeing my profits increase while losing the deeper sense of fulfillment].
- 4) Passion-to-Profit Ratio? What's that?

G. How much of your new business already is (or you fear will be if you expand) about the 24/7 all-work and no-play side of being an entrepreneur?

- 1) None. Thankfully, my business allows me plenty of free time.
- 2) Not much, and the workload/time spent on my business has steadily decreased over time.
- 3) A lot, but isn't that the ONLY way to succeed in business?
- 4) Too much, and I wish it would slow down! I haven't seen my friends in months!

H. How trapped do you feel in your business?

- 1) Not at all. I'm thrilled to say I could leave this venture whenever I wanted, which I don't.
- 2) Somewhat, but not to the point where it causes anxiety.
- 3) Very: I feel like I'm sacrificing my passions because I'm too worried about profits, and I'm losing sight of why I started this venture in the first place.
- Frighteningly so: I feel like if something doesn't change soon, this business will fail and/or I will go broke.



I. If you won the Powerball or inherited \$500 million tomorrow, would you continue with your business?

- 1) This hypothetical doesn't apply to me, because my business has nothing to do with profits.
- 2) Yes, and I'd use the money to expand my business.
- 3) Yes, but I'd consider hiring everyone else to run things so I could step away from the details. I'd need help to focus on my expertise.
- 4) No: I'd bail right NOW If I could, but I fear I'd regret it.

J. Whether you are contemplating starting a new business or expanding your current business, what's holding you back?

- 1) Nothing: I'm going for it!
- 2) Self-Doubt or Complacency: I either let my self-doubt get the better of me, think I should know how to do it all on my own or think it's so much easier to stay where I'm at, where it's familiar and comfortable even though I'm not reaching for my big dream.
- 3) Fear and anxiety about doing it "wrong," making bad business decisions or creating a business that's no fun anymore so I lose my passion.
- 4) I've got myself convinced it's a lack of resources like time, money or know-how.

K. How do you feel your passions relate to your career path?

- 1) I believe people can have joy and purpose in their career, and I am on a healthy professional path to being paid well for doing what feeds my soul.
- 2) A person can't make money doing something heart-centered, and if you want to make a difference in the world or in your soul, you will be broke. Conversely, the businesspeople who earn lucrative profits are "corporate stiffs" who endure the daily grind. I'm not sure you can have it both ways.
- 3) I wish I could turn my passions into a career, to make a living doing what I love, but I don't know how to turn passion into profit.
- 4) Both 2 and 3.

L. How meaningful — a deep sense of purpose — is your current business, whether you feel like you're making a difference in the world or in those around you or in your own self?

- 1) INCREDIBLY! I am fully being enriched or enriching others.
- 2) Fairly; I usually feel purposeful, but we all have our rough patches.
- 3) Somewhat, but I wish I more consistently felt my passion and had a deeper purpose in my business.
- 4) Not very or not at all: This has turned into a stress, a daily grind, a void, and I feel like I'm going through the motions. I long for it to be different.


